Albert Einstein Distinguished Educator Fellowships allow elementary & secondary math & science teachers to spend a year in Washington, D.C. Selected teachers spend up to a year in a Congressional office, the Department of Energy (DOE), the National Science Foundation (NSF), the National Aeronautics & Space Administration (NASA), the National Institutes of Health (NIH), the Department of Education (ED), or the White House Office of Science & Technology Policy (OSTP) Annual: \$5000 monthly stipend, plus moving expenses to and from Washington DC.

“The ING Unsung Heroes awards program recognizes innovative and progressive thinking in education through monetary awards. Each year, one hundred finalists, along with their schools, are selected to receive \$2,000 each from ING to fund innovative projects they have initiated or would like to create. Three of them are chosen to receive the top prizes - an additional \$5,000, \$10,000, and \$25,000 for the grand prize winner. Award checks are made payable jointly to the recipient and his/her school. To ensure impartiality, the finalists are selected by Scholarship America. With the budgetary constraints in today's schools, this program is ING's way of recognizing those classroom heroes who often have to use their own money to implement their projects. To be eligible, applicants must be employed by an accredited K-12 public or private school, and be full-time educators, teachers, principals, paraprofessionals, or classified staff members with effective projects that improve student learning. All awards must be used to further the projects within the school or school system.”
